ORDER


classification (334, Computer Specialist), which he formerly held. He has been assigned to perform work, within his classification, in the Information Management and Technology Division (IMTEC). His assignments have been similar to those he had formerly been assigned in the Accounting and Financial Management Division (AFMD). He will be assigned in the future to assignments wherein his knowledge, skills and abilities as a GS-334/13 Computer Specialist will be matched against job requirements.

2. In February 1984, the group to which Mr. Ramey had formerly been assigned was abolished pursuant to a reorganization. Currently there are only seven computer specialists in AFMD and AFMD would be unable to effectively use any additional 334 computer specialists.

3. The February 1984 reorganization was effected in order to improve financial management throughout the federal government.

Based upon the above undisputed facts of record, GAO has demonstrated that it has made a good-faith effort to comply with the Board's order of July 10, 1986.

The Petition for Enforcement of Final Decision dated September 30, 1986, should be and hereby is DENIED.
